
BEGIN A NEW LIFE


How is God present with you?

God is life itself. Everything else, the stars, the earth, plants, animals, and people have life and existence from God. Nothing exists independently except God. The New Church teaches that the Lord Jesus Christ is the human manifestation of God. Jesus said, "For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son to have life in Himself" (John 5:26), and "He who has seen Me has seen the Father" (John 14:9).

God is uniquely present with people through the Word or Bible. From the Word we can come to understand and connect with a visible God, who is Jesus Christ. He is also present in all the abilities that make us human. The Lord provides and constantly maintains our ability to judge what we believe is right and wrong and to freely choose how we will live. When we choose to follow what God teaches, we grow in wisdom. We become increasingly, personally, connected to Him as spiritual people.

"Are not five sparrows sold for two copper coins? And not one of them is forgotten before God? But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Do not fear therefore; you are of more value than many sparrow" (Luke 12:6,7).





Where is God when bad things happen?

God is present in the events of our lives. Sometimes it may seem to us that this can't be true. Bad things happen to us and to people we love and we wonder where God is and why He let this happen. God is at work in the smallest details of everyone's life. Nothing is allowed to happen that will not potentially be able to serve the goal of our eternal well being. The Lord never interferes with our spiritual freedom to choose how we want to live.

The harmful or evil actions in life come from two general causes. One is that human beings have a tendency to love controlling and having power over other people. The second source of harm is that we have a tendency to love possessions. No matter how much we have, we generally want more. The Lord allows all people to act freely according to their own rational thought, so these two harmful drives are not always restrained in us or in society. If these desires were not allowed to surface, we would not clearly see how harmful they are to us and others. Along with this

clarity comes the choice to accept or reject these desires. By freely choosing to reject them, we are spiritually reborn. This freedom to make good or poor choices is one of the reasons that evil and harmful actions are not prevented by acts of God.

The Lord loves us and never wishes us to suffer. He grieves for the tears and the hurt that we feel. Emanuel Swedenborg uses the word 'permission' to describe things the Lord does not want to have happen but which He allows to occur. As we are ready, the Lord works in our hearts and lives to heal us. He uses even these sad experiences to help us become more loving, compassionate, wise and forgiving.
