





From the Desk of the Bishop

Friends,

The Lord is with you. Like so many of you, each year I revisit the Christmas story to drink in the familiar names and events which serve as the inspiration for our celebrations. This year a five-word phrase jumped out—words that were said to Mary but which stand as a comforting truth for us all: “The Lord is with you.” It’s part of a larger greeting, “Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!” (Luke 1:28).

Considering those five words, we note that the Lord said them to many people whose lives are recorded in the Word—to Joshua as he was about to lead the Israelites into Canaan—“The Lord your God is with you wherever you go” (Joshua 1:9); to His disciples in the resurrection—“Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age” (Mathew 28:20); and to all of us in the most famous of the Psalms: “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me...” (23:4). It is also why He chose to be called by the name Immanuel, “which is translated ‘God with us’” (Matthew 1:23; Isaiah 7:14).

The Lord wants us to know and to believe deeply that He is with us in all things of life. As we read in the Heavenly Doctrines, “‘And God will be with you’ means the Lord’s Divine Providence.... For when the Lord is with someone He leads that person and makes provision so that all that happens, whether sad or joyful, may bring him what is good. This is Divine Providence” (Arcana Coelestia 6303).

A prayer that I set before you is that this season be one where you experience the Lord’s presence, and renew your commitment to work with Him as He leads you forward in His providence to what is good.
